

Three Arts Club Adopts Official Seal

The Three Arts Club of Homeland now has a seal. It made its first appearance on the program for the club's last meeting of the season.

A navy circle, edged with gold, the seal is divided into three sections, each containing a symbol, in gold on a navy background, of the three arts which the club fosters in its monthly programs at the Baltimore Museum of Art.

A palette and brushes represent the art of painting; a feather pen and scroll, literature; and a harp, music.
